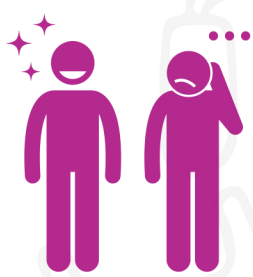


Seven Golden Rules for successful Integrated Project Delivery (IPD)



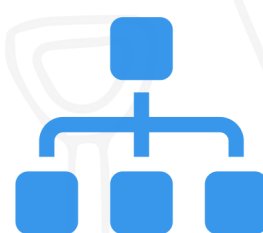
Vision & Strategy - Develop your own **guiding star** to give purpose and direction, achieve greater integration and get **enterprise ready**. Ensure a Vision and Strategy are in place for the project that sets out how the Integrated Project Team (IPT) will succeed and **aligns outcomes** for all stakeholders.

Leadership - Take responsibility to demonstrate behaviours and integrity that help lead to greater integration. **Constructively challenge** poor behaviours, processes and approaches - **"Don't walk by"**



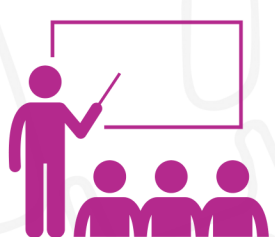
Behaviours - **Drive greater engagement** across the Integrated Project Team. Involving parties that are likely to be affected if something needs changing or improving will get better results. **Create a safe working environment for all.**

Organisation & Structure - Create integrated teams that aren't defined by company boundaries. Everyone is part of the team, but some are further away from the core and may have a different perspective. **We need to reach the places we don't normally touch**



Lean, CI & VE - Take full advantage of **earlier engagement** in schemes to drive fundamental improvements in delivery and performance - **proactively use Lean and Value Engineering.**

Data & Systems - Create systems that everyone in the integrated team can access, sharing **one version of the truth**. Question any system or platform that does not allow full access for all IPT stakeholders.



Education & Learning - Commit to ongoing education and learning and associated new ways of working. Be proactive in engaging, sharing and learning as a wider community. **This is a new world that has been created and we need to learn how to live and thrive in it.**
